Daffodils (M)

Running Time: 93 minutes

Leaving her dying father's bedside, singer Maisie rushes to perform at an indie music gig in town. But as she sings the opening song, it's hard for her to ignore the heartfelt story she's just been told – the story of how her dad met and fell in love with her mother, and how it all devastatingly fell apart. As the night goes on, we see the love story of Eric and Rose through Maisie's eyes. From the time they meet in Hamilton in 1966 to their separation in the 1980s, we follow the bittersweet nuances of a couple's life, expressed with contemporary re-imaginings of iconic hit songs of New Zealand artists including **Crowded House**, **Bic Runga** and **Dave Dobbyn**.

Daffodils is a heart-aching drama of a quintessential New Zealand marriage, told with iconic New Zealand music.



Swimming with Men (M)

Running Time: 97 minutes

Rob Brydon stars alongside a talented British cast in this comedy that tips its (swimming) cap at beloved British comedies such as *The Full Monty* and *Calendar Girls*. Inspired by the **Dylan Williams** 2010 documentary, *Men Who Swim*.

Swimming with Men tells the story of a man (**Brydon**) who is suffering a mid-life crisis and eventually finds new meaning to his life as part of an all-male, middle-aged, amateur synchronised swimming team. Together they make a bid to compete at the unofficial Male Sync-Swimming World Championships, and no doubt a shot at personal redemption along the way.



On the Basis of Sex (M)

Running Time: 120 minutes

On the Basis of Sex is inspired by the true story of a young **Ruth Bader Ginsburg** – then a struggling attorney and new mother – who faces adversity and numerous obstacles in her fight for equal rights throughout her career.

When Ruth takes on a groundbreaking tax case with her husband, attorney Martin Ginsburg, she knows it could change the direction of her career and the way the courts view gender discrimination. The film also chronicles the storybook-like romance between Ruth and Marty, a partnership that succeeded both personally and professionally.

Holy Lands (M)

Running Time: 96 minutes

Facing a crossroads in life, Harry Rosenmerck (Academy Award nominee **James Caan**) leaves New York and his family with an unlikely plan to start a pig farm in Nazareth, causing the anger of local communities. His conflict with the town Rabbi, Moshe Cattan (BAFTA award winner **Tom Hollander**) slowly turns into a friendship that leads him to reevaluate his relationship with his estranged family, including his difficult ex-wife, his 34-year-old student daughter, and his playwright son David. Through an emotional journey, this dysfunctional group will try to make their way back to each other, renewing ties when they all need it the most.



Hotel Mumbai (R16)

Running Time: 97 minutes

Hotel Mumbai is based on the true story of the devastating terrorist attack on the Taj Mahal Palace Hotel in 2008.

The terrifying assault brings together the guests and staff of the luxurious hotel including wealthy new parents David and Zahra (**Armie Hammer** and **Nazanin Boniadi**), Russian businessman Vasili (**Jason Issacs**) and newly promoted waiter Arjun (**Dev Patel**) in a desperate fight for survival. This story celebrates humanity, compassion, courage, resilience and the unwavering desire to survive.



Stan & Ollie (PG)

Running Time: 98 minutes

The true story of Hollywood's greatest comedy double act, Laurel and Hardy, is brought to the big screen for the first time. Starring **Steve Coogan** and **John C. Reilly** as the legendary movie icons, *Stan & Ollie* is the heart-warming story of what would become the pair's triumphant farewell tour.

With their golden era long behind them, the pair embark on a variety hall tour of Britain and Ireland. Despite the pressures of a hectic schedule, and with the support of their wives Lucille (**Shirley Henderson**) and Ida (**Nina Arianda**) – a formidable double act in their own right – the pair's love of performing, as well as for each other, endures as they secure their place in the hearts of their adoring public.



Celia (Ex)

Running Time: 100 minutes

Celia Lashlie wasn't afraid to speak up... this film was her last chance to do so.

After receiving a terminal cancer diagnosis in late 2014, **Celia** asked her friend, award-winning journalist **Amanda Millar** to film the final year of her life to ensure her unfinished work could go on. In February 2015, Amanda was summonsed to bring a camera to Celia's home for what turned out to be the only interview for this film. Two days later, Celia passed away.

Celia presents the transformational effect of this one charismatic woman in the lives of some of the most at-risk people in the country. This film represented her last chance to not only open up about her life and work but also share her vital messages about how to change the lives of those involved in New Zealand's appalling violence, child mortality, prison and suicide statistics.


