Love, Weddings and Other Disasters (tbc) Running Time: 90 minutes

A multi-story romantic comedy about the people who work on weddings to create the perfect day for a loving couple – while their own relationships are outlandish, odd, crazy and far from perfect. Stars **Maggie Grace** (*Taken*) alongside Oscar-winners **Diane Keaton** and **Jeremy Irons**.



Wild Mountain Thyme (PG)

Running Time: 103 minutes

A madcap love story with soaring lyricism, *Wild Mountain Thyme* is set against the breath-taking landscapes of rural Ireland, where everyone is half mad with loneliness or love, and the weather is terrible.

Anthony **(Dornan)** always seems to be out in the fields working, worn down by his father's constant belittling. But what really stings is his father's threat to bequeath the family farm to his American cousin Adam. Rosemary **(Blunt)** at first seems to hold a grudge for having been shamed by Anthony in childhood, but the sparks between them would keep a bonfire blazing through the night. Her mother Aoife strives to unite the families before it is too late. Just when we think Anthony will pluck up the courage to face up to his repressed feelings, cousin Adam **(Hamm)** steps in with a plan to sweep Rosemary off her feet, romancing her over a magical 24 hours in Manhattan. But true love is never defeated!

Spread Your Wings (M) Running Time: 98 minutes

A mother sends her videogame-addicted teenager Thomas to spend the school holidays with his father in the beautiful, yet secluded, wetlands of the Camargue region in Southern France. With no Wi-Fi and only his ornithologist father for company, Thomas is slowly drawn into his father's passion for a gaggle of newborn, wild geese. Together, father and son train the birds for their first migratory flight, hoping to free them from captivity while also rebuilding their own strained relationship. *In French with English Subtitles*



Penguin Bloom (PG) Running Time: 95 minutes

Penguin Bloom tells the true story of Sam Bloom (Academy Award® nominated **Naomi Watts**) a young mother whose world is turned upside down after a near-fatal accident leaves her unable

is turned upside down after a near-fatal accident leaves her unable to walk. Sam's husband, (Andrew Lincoln), her three young boys and her mother (Academy Award® nominated Jacki Weaver), are struggling to adjust to their new situation when an unlikely ally enters their world in the form of an injured baby magpie they name Penguin. The bird's arrival is a welcome distraction for the Bloom family, eventually making a profound difference in the family's life.

Music (M) Running Time: 107 minutes

Zu **(Hudson)** is a free spirit estranged from her family who suddenly finds herself the sole guardian of her half sister, Music **(Ziegler)**, a teenager on the autism spectrum whose whole world order has been beautifully crafted by her late grandmother. The musical drama explores the tenuous bonds that hold us together, and imagines a world where those bonds can be strengthened in times of great challenge: love, trust, and being able to be there for each other is everything. *MUSIC* is a powerful, original, and celebratory artistic statement and the directorial debut of multi-Grammy nominee and internationally acclaimed singer-songwriter and pop icon **Sia**.



The Dry (M) Running Time: 117 minutes

When Federal Agent Aaron Falk returns to his home town after an absence of over twenty years to attend the funeral of his childhood friend, Luke, who allegedly killed his wife and child before taking his own life – a victim of the madness that has ravaged this community after more than a decade of drought. When Falk reluctantly agrees to stay and investigate the crime, he opens up an old wound – the death of 17- year-old Ellie Deacon. Falk begins to suspect these two crimes, separated by decades, are connected. As he struggles to prove not only Luke's innocence but also his own, Falk finds himself pitted against the prejudice towards him and and pent-up rage of a terrified community.



A Call To Spy (M) Running Time: 124 minutes

In the beginning of WWII, with Britain becoming desperate, Churchill orders his new spy agency -- the Special Operations Executive (SOE) -- to recruit and train women as spies. Their daunting mission: conduct sabotage and build a resistance. SOE's "spymistress," Vera Atkins (Stana Katic), recruits two unusual candidates: Virginia Hall (Sarah Megan Thomas), an ambitious American with a wooden leg, and Noor Inayat Khan (Radhika Atpe), a Muslim pacifist. Together, these women help to undermine the Nazi regime in France, leaving an unmistakable legacy in their wake. Inspired by true stories.



From The Vine (M) Running Time: 94 minutes

Emmy-winner **Joe Pantoliano** (*The Sopranos*) plays a downtrodden man who experiences an ethical crisis and travels back to his hometown in rural Italy to recalibrate his moral compass. There he finds new purpose in reviving his grandfather's old vineyard, offering the small town of Acerenza a sustainable future, and reconnecting with his estranged family in the process.



Summerland (PG) Running Time: 99 minutes

Summerland follows the story of fiercely independent folklore investigator, Alice **(Gemma Arterton)** who secludes herself in her clifftop study, debunking myths using science to disprove the existence of magic.



The Witches (M) Running Time: 104 minutes

Reimagining Roald Dahl's beloved story for a modern audience, Zemeckis's visually innovative The Witches tells the scary, funny and imaginative tale of a seven year old boy who has a run in with some real life witches!



Blithe Spirit (PG) Running Time: 99 minutes

Dan Stevens, Isla Fisher, Leslie Mann and **Judi Dench** star in this adaptation of the 1941 **Noël Coward** play about the comedic and complex love triangle brought about by a seance gone wrong.
