This Town (M)

Running Time: 91 minutes

A Comedy About Love, Murder, and Finding the One. Acquitted of a crime, Sean is a young man trying to rebuild his life. Pam, an ex-cop turned Petting Zoo and Adventure Park™ owner is convinced of his murderous tendencies and will do anything to prove his guilt. Five years on from the crime, Sean starts where any millennial would – with online dating. He meets Casey, a quirky young woman who believes in his innocence. Together they push the limits of love after murder, but with every step forward Pam is trying to pull them back, well, after feeding the Alpacas. Charting the sublimely awkward aftermath of a small town tragedy, *This Town* is a touchingly twisted comedy about finding love when your world is against you.



The Personal History of David Copperfield (PG)

Running Time: 119 minutes

From Rags to Riches... and Back Again. A fresh and distinctive take on Charles Dickens' semi-autobiographical masterpiece. *The Personal History of David Copperfield*, set in the 1840's, chronicles the life of its iconic title character (played by **Dev Patel**) as he navigates a chaotic world to find his elusive place within it. From his unhappy childhood to the discovery of his gift as a storyteller and writer, David's journey is by turns hilarious and tragic but always full of life, colour and humanity.



Bel Canto (M)

Running Time: 101 minutes

A world-renowned opera singer becomes trapped in a hostage situation when she's invited to perform for a wealthy industrialist in South America. Starring **Julianne Moore, Ken Watanabe, Sebastian Koch, and Christopher Lambert.**



Military Wives (M)

Running Time: 112 minutes

Following a group of women in England whose partners are away serving in Afghanistan. Faced with the men's absences, they form a choir and quickly find themselves at the centre of a media sensation and global movement. Inspired by global phenomenon of military wives choirs, the story celebrates a band of misfit women who form a choir on a military base.

The Burnt Orange Heresy (R13)

Running Time: 98 minutes

Charming and ambitious art critic, James Figueras (**Claes Bang**), has fallen from grace. He spends his days in Milan lecturing witless tourists about art history. His only glimmer of hope is a new-found love interest, the enigmatic American, Berenice Hollis (**Elizabeth Debicki**). An opportunity strikes when he is contacted by wealthy art dealer Joseph Cassidy (**Mick Jagger**) who summons James to his villa on Lake Como and ask him to steal a painting from the legendary reclusive artist, Jerome Debney (**Donald Sutherland**). Soon, James' greed and ambition get the better of him, and he finds himself caught in a web of his own making.



Greed (R13)

Running Time: 104 minutes

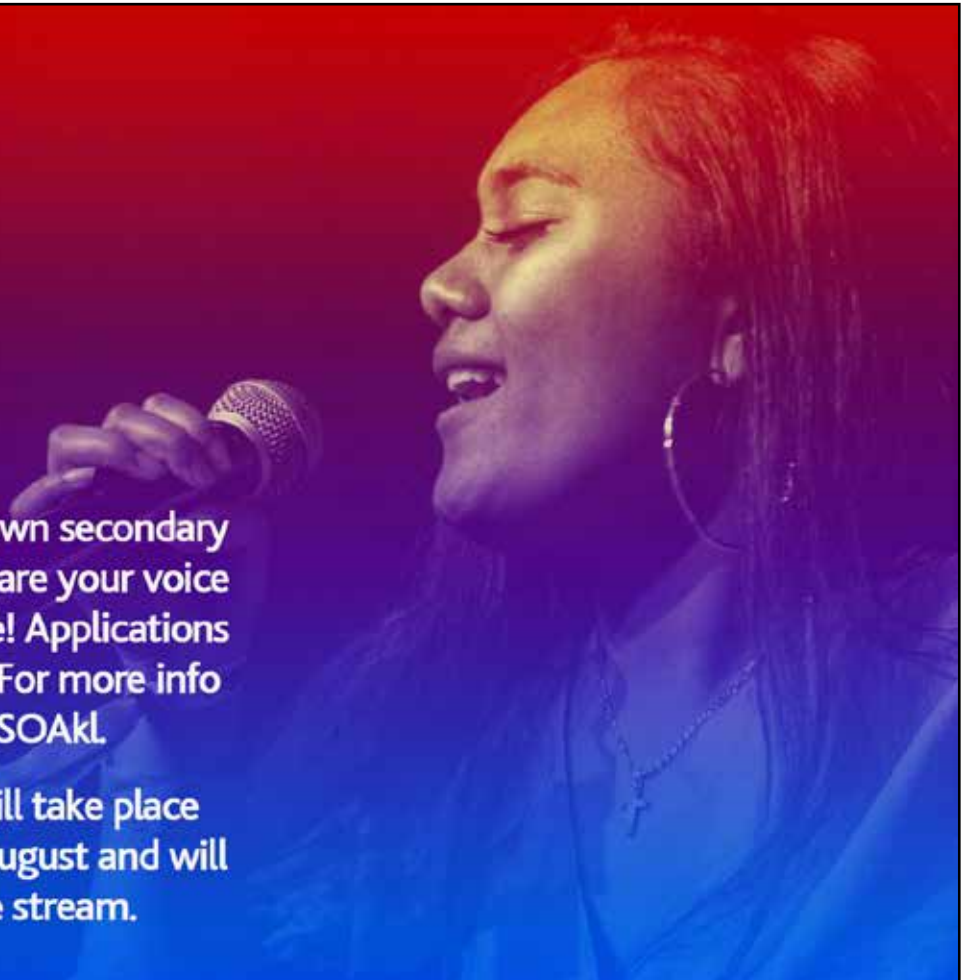
Greed tells the story of self-made British billionaire Sir Richard McCreadie (**Steve Coogan**), whose retail empire is in crisis. For 30 years he has ruled the world of retail fashion – bringing the high street to the catwalk and the catwalk to the high street – but after a damaging public inquiry, his image is tarnished. To save his reputation, he decides to bounce back with a highly publicised and extravagant party celebrating his 60th birthday on the Greek island of Mykonos. A satire on the grotesque inequality of wealth in the fashion industry, the film sees McCreadie's rise and fall through the eyes of his biographer, Nick (**David Mitchell**).

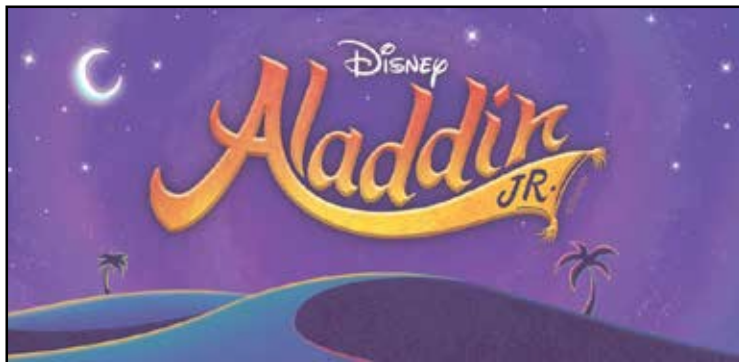
