Book Club: The Next Chapter (M)

Running Time: 107 minutes

The highly anticipated sequel follows our four best friends as they take their book club to Italy for the fun girls trip they never had. When things go off the rails and secrets are revealed, their relaxing vacation turns into a once-in-a-lifetime cross-country adventure.



A Good Person (R16)

Running Time: 129 minutes

Allison is a young woman with a wonderful fiancé, a blossoming career, and supportive family and friends. However, her world crumbles in the blink of an eye when she survives an unimaginable tragedy, emerging from recovery with an opioid addiction and unresolved grief. In the following years, she forms an unlikely friendship with her would-be father-in-law that gives her a fighting chance to put her life back together and move forward.



My Neighbour Adolf (M)

Running Time: 91 minutes

South America, 1960. A lonely and grumpy Holocaust survivor convinces himself that his new neighbor is none other than **Adolf Hitler**. Not being taken seriously, he starts an independent investigation to prove his claim, but when the evidence still appears to be inconclusive, Polsky is forced to engage in a relationship with the enemy in order to obtain irrefutable proof.



Marlowe (R13)

Running Time: 109 minutes

Marlowe, a gripping noir crime thriller set in late 1930's **Los Angeles**, centers around a street-wise, down on his luck detective; Philip Marlowe, played by **Liam Neeson**, who is hired to find the ex-lover of a glamorous heiress (**Diane Kruger**), daughter of a well-known movie star (**Jessica Lange**). The disappearance unearths a web of lies, and soon *Marlowe* is involved in a dangerous, deadly investigation where everyone involved has something to hide.

Running Time: 129 minutes

Big George Foreman: The Miraculous Story of the Once and Future Heavyweight Champion of the World is based on the remarkable true story of one of the greatest comebacks of all time and the transformational power of second chances. Fueled by an impoverished childhood, Foreman channeled his anger into becoming an Olympic Gold medalist and World Heavyweight Champion, followed by a near-death experience that took him from the boxing ring to the pulpit. But when he sees his community struggling spiritually and financially, Foreman returns to the ring and makes history by reclaiming his title, becoming the oldest and most improbable World Heavyweight Boxing Champion ever.
